1001	A Webley Premier MkII .22 cal air pistol batch No.306 (N.B. chip to base of R/H grip), as a post 1939 air weapon the restrictions of the Crime Reduction Act apply to the sale and delivery of this item
1002	A London marked percussion over and under pistol, 14 1/4" overall with 8 1/2" barrels of approx 22 bore (N.B. this pistol is 'well worn' and is as found)
1003	A percussion over and under pistol, 16" overall with 9 1/2" barrels of approx 18 bore, two stage locks good, rod in place and butt trap with 'figure head', an interesting pistol
1004	An extremely rare Civil War Allen & Wheelock centre hammer .44 cal Army percussion revolver, one of only possibly approx 700 made 1861-1862, this example is number 193, in overall good condition with fine grips and crisp action
1005	A Colt 1862 Police conversion 1873-75 from .36 percussion to .38 rim fire metallic cartridge, S/No.7462, barrel markings 'Address Col Sam'l Colt New-York U.S. America', left side of frame marked 'Pat July 25th 1871, Pat July 2 1872', matching numbers, but cylinder seems unmarked, ejector rod in plac ...[more]
1006	A Colt 1861 Navy conversion c1875 with Richards-Mason method, from .36 percussion to .38 rim fire metallic cartridge, S/No.748 on all numbered parts including cylinder with Naval scene still present, 4 1/2" barrel marked 'Address Col Sam'l Colt New-York U.S. America', left side of frame marked Colts ...[more]
1007	A Colt '1851' Navy percussion revolver, S/No.2212 matching on all numbered parts, with the cylinder numbered 212, the cylinder also with good Naval scene and marked Engaged 16 May 1843, the 7 1/2" barrel marked 'Address Sam'l Colt New York City', this example has small round trigger guard and wedge ...[more]
1008	A drum and nipple percussion conversion of a Light Dragoon Yeomanry 'Flintlock pistol', 15" overall with a 9" barrel of .65" bore, working two stage lock marked with crowned G.R., brass furniture and replacement rod, lock plate also maker marked Ryan & Watson (1777-1818)
1009	A 'Liege' proofed 12mm pin fire six shot double action revolver, in good condition (loading gate catch missing)
1010	Five various percussion revolvers including a Manhattan .31cal pocket revolver with ivory grips (please be aware all five revolvers are as found)
1011	Five various single shot pistols, one Flintlock, one percussion conversion from Flintlock and three percussion (please be aware all five pistols are as found)
1012	A small Flintlock pocket pistol by Smith, Bond Street, London, approx 5 1/4" overall with a turn off 'cannon' barrel of approx 1 1/2" and 80 bore, slab sided on piece grip with white metal wire inlay (action a little weak)

- 1017 A Henry Deringer style pocket pistol, overall approx 6 1/2" with a 3" barrel of approx .41" rifled bore, no makers mark but a fine quality pistol

- 1020 A Brown MFG (and Merrimack Arms Co) Southerner Derringer, .41" cal rim fire, S/No.4982 (made 1866-1869), total of approx 6500, L/S of barrel marked Merrimack Arms & Manufacturing Co / Newport, Mass / Patented April 9th 1867, while barrel flat marked Southerner, in fine overall condition with fin ...[more]

- 1021 A Colt No.1 (first model) Derringer in .41 rim fire cal, S/No.1640, production of approx 6500 (1870-1890), barrel flat marked Colts Pt. F.A. MFG.Co Hartford CT. U.S.A. No.1, scroll engraving on both sides as standard, overall a very good example of a classic Derringer

- 1022 A percussion alarm gun of approx 7 bore, possibly a later conversion (with some restoration and remounting on base), approx 36" long

- 1023 A Remington over-under Derringer in .41" rim fire cal (made 1866-1935), this fine example is a type 1 (late production, A.K.A. model No.2) made c1868, barrel flat marked E Remington & Sons Ilion N.Y. Elliotts Patent Dec 12th 1865, a good early plated example with ivory grips and in a later lined ...[more]

- 1024 A Remington over-under Derringer in .41" rim fire cal (made 1866-1935), this example is a type II, A.K.A. model No.3 (made 1888-1911), barrel flat marked 'Remington Arms Co Ilion. - 1027 A Tippings & Lawden (Sharps patent) model 2, four barrel pepperbox in .30 rim fire cal, S/No.4507 c1860-1870), this example with gutta-percha grips and high percentage of original plating remaining, in a later lined box

- 1028 A rare James Reid knuckle-duster revolver in .32 rim fire cal, S/No.8166 c1870-1882. L/H side of top strap marked 'My Friend Pat'd Dec 26 1865', this example being the brass frame model with blued cylinder etc (N.B. blued parts have at some time been re-finished), within unassociated box

- 1034 A Colt New Line revolver, S/No.6042 from a production run of approx 7000 1874-1879, this five shot example has a 2 1/4" barrel, rosewood 'birds head' grips, L/H side of barrel marked Colt New 41, L/H side frame 41 cal with barrel marked Colts PT.F.A. MFG.Co.Hartford.CT. U.S.A., in a later fitted box ...[more]

- 1035 A Forehand & Wadsworth c1870 .41 rim fire cal five shot revolver, 'Swamp Angel' marked on top frame, plated and engraved throughout with ivory grips, in a later lined antique box (N.B. plating wear)

- 1036 A Colt .31" model 1849 pocket revolver, S/No.88313 c1854 with 4" barrel, matching No.s throughout including loading lever, L/H side of framed marked Colts Patent with barrel flat marked Address Sam'l Colt New York City, cylinder with faint scene and good grips, the revolver comes with period English ...[more]

- 1037 A Colt revolver with a 3 1/2" round (cartridge) barrel in .38 rim fire cal, produced 1873-1880, this conversion from 1862 Police/pocket Navy and using 1849 pocket model parts, this example has matching No.s (3354), L/H frame marked Pat July 25 1871-Pat July 2 1872 and barrel marked Colts P.T. F.A. M ...[more]

- 1038 A Civil War era Colt model 1860 Army percussion revolver in .44" cal, S/No.90423 c1863, matching numbers with cylinder marked Pat Sept 10th 1850 (serial number worn), L/H side frame marked Colts Patent with 8" barrel marked Address Col Sam'l Colt New-York U.S.America, no finish but a good even patin ...[more]

- 1039 A Civil War era Remington percussion new model Army revolver in .44 cal, S/No.122184 produced 1863-1875, this example has an excellent bore and Government stamping within cartouche on L/H grip (faint) and inspectors initials on other parts, this classic Civil War revolver has also been converted to ...[more]

- 1040 A 'Colt style' five shot percussion pocket pistol in .31" cal, S/No.1907273 (action as found and in an unassociated fitted box)

- 1041 A six shot 5mm pin fire cal baby revolver, 5" overall with a 2" hexagonal barrel, this is a plated example with ivory grips, in overall good condition with single and double action seem to be working, housed within a vintage lined box

- 1055 A percussion 'overcoat' pistol by Beattie London, with captive ramrod, overall 11 1/2" with a 6 1/4" sighted barrel of approx 20 bore, two stage lock working well with plate marked Beattie and barrel flat marked London, within its later fitted case with accessories
